Dear Mr. Mark Delventhal,

The Hawaii State Department of Health, Hazard Evaluation and Emergency Response Office (HEER) did not receive a report for the petroleum spill that occurred at the intersection of Sand Island Access Road and the road in between Hawaii Independent Energy (HIE) and Aircraft Service International Group (ASIG, on Friday, 05 September, 2014.

In accordance with HRS128D-3c, any person who fails to report a hazardous substance, which includes oil, release to the Department immediately upon knowledge of the release shall be subject to a civil penalty in an amount not to exceed \$10,000 for each day of failure to report, or subject to prosecution for a criminal misdemeanor.

The HEER Office requests that you provide a complete explanation of the reported incident. The information should include, but not be limited to, any steps taken to cleanup the contamination area. The exact nature and cause of the release along with any corrective action taken to prevent reoccurrence should be addressed.

Your reply to this letter should be in writing, signed by you or a duly authorized official of the company and submitted to the HEER Office within 30 calendar days of receipt of this letter.
